Love is the Way. "To love, my brothers and sisters, does not mean we have to agree. But maybe agreeing to love is the greatest agreement. And the only one that ultimately matters, because it makes a future possible." Thank you, Carole, for this timely reminder for me.

I take words very seriously. I reserve the word "love" for reference to my family and very close friends. But I think the above quote applies to everyone, be they loved ones, acquaintances, or even people I have just met. I interpret the quote to mean we don't have to agree on everything. Everyone is entitled to their own thoughts and opinions, and we should all be accepting and respectful of that. It is an opportunity for an exchange of thoughts in a calm and respectful manner. It could elevate to lively banter, but no shouting or name calling.

Think of how boring conversations would be if you and your loved ones agreed on everything. Who would you roll your eyes at if everyone in the family was either a USC or UCLA fan? Or how many turkeys would you need to cook for Thanksgiving if everyone wanted white meat? Or how much less violence would there be in the world if the nuts I am always hearing about in the news would walk away from disagreements instead of elevating confrontations to physical attacks?

On the other side of the coin, I can be very stubborn at times. No amount of discussion will change my mind. Tim has learned that over the years. But I am open to hearing whatever comments you may have. You probably won't change my mind, but I am interested in what you have to say. At the very least I might pick up some points that I feel would support my position even more, at the most I might (underscore might) change my mind to your way of thinking.

The quote is a reminder to me that one way I can do the loving thing is by being courteous and respectful when people express an opinion that is different from mine. What does it say to you?

#### From Stan Jamieson



- (1) The Vanco on line giving program facilitates automatic giving. I know that many people prefer furnishing a physical check either by mail or placing in the donation plate at church. This method is time consuming and causes extra work for our accounting staff at St. Matthias. Our on line giving portal makes giving simple and eliminates a lot of paper work.


