From Senior Warden Tim Adams

I was tremendously heartened by the turnout at the Annual Meeting of St. Matthias on Sunday, February 12. It comes at a time when it's important to see exactly who is St. Matthias. The fact that so many of you came out to allow your voices to be heard and to learn about what is happening at St. Matthias is encouraging. I hope you all will continue to be seen and heard during this time of change and growth.

There were a couple of things that I failed to mention that are important for you to know. When the Vestry made its budget decisions there were three areas, we agreed we needed to focus upon to get us to a balanced budget. The areas are staffing, our diocesan pledge and appeal for increased giving. Allow me to provide a little more background to what is happening in these areas.

With regard to staffing, the Vestry has and will continue to look at ways in which we can become more efficient with our staff. Effective March 1, 2023, the church office hours will be modified to 10AM to 4PM with a one-hour closure from 12PM to 1PM. In this particular circumstance we will modify the salary of our Office Administrator, Dottie Andersen. Staff considerations are particularly challenging because of the relationships we develop over time with our staff members. St. Matthias is no exception, and we greatly value the work of all our staffers.

Every year, we are assessed an amount to contribute for our diocesan pledge. Last year we fulfilled our pledge in the amount of \$30,000. We are increasing our pledge this year to the amount of \$36,000. In a December letter from the diocese, it was explained that our pledge would increase to upwards of \$53,000, based upon our 2021 income (the formula derived by the diocese). Given our present financial circumstance that amount will be extremely difficult to meet. The diocese has expressed their willingness to engage in discussion with those parishes who may anticipate challenges in meeting the prescribed amount. We will reach out to the diocese with the intent to reach an agreement on an amount that we can realistically undertake.

With regard to increased giving, we have only to look at our pledge income over the last couple of years and this year to see that we experienced a significant drop-off in this vital area. We can anticipate a vigorous Stewardship campaign this year with the hope of closing the gap in pledge giving. Consider making or increasing your pledge this year. It was determined that if every pledging household increased its pledge by \$8.00 a week, we would achieve a balanced with no deficit. It's imperative that we keep a tight focus on this subject especially given our impending search for a new rector. If we wish to employ a full-time rector, we should be willing to expend upwards of \$100,000 for salary and benefits if we wish to attract top candidates for consideration.

In September of 2022, we entered into an agreement with Fr. J.R. Lander III to be our interim pastor. That agreement was subject to our continued and mutual satisfaction with his ministry at St. Matthias. At the end of January 2023, the Vestry voted to terminate our agreement and it provided Fr. Lander thirty (30) days within which to respond. Upon receipt of the notice to terminate the agreement, Fr. Lander declined to oppose the termination and we mutually agreed to end our relationship with him, forthwith. We may, at least for the shortterm, realize some savings absent Fr. Lander's salary. But we must bear in mind that a replacement to fill his role is a necessity to support and guide us as we move forward through Transition

I anticipate this being my last submission for the Messenger as someone else will be assuming the role of Sr. Warden as I step aside in the interest of my health. I will complete my term on the Vestry, and I will continue to work to advance St. Matthias as an address for God's kingdom in our community. I hope everyone will continue to work together toward that goal, always remembering to do the loving thing!

LENTEN SERIES




EASTER LILIES




