I guessed we passed their assessment as we went on to prepare and serve a meal on Mondays for years to come.

And from then on, St. Matthias continued to draw me in and my non involvement once a Sunday only policy was thrown out of the window. So if you too are thinking I don't want to do anything more than come to church on Sunday, think again as there is something for everyone at St. Matthias.

There is a Stitchery Group that meets on the 3rd Sunday of each month and any one, regardless of gender are welcome to just show up and knit, sew, embroider, do cross stitch, crochet or whatever makes you happy.

If you would like to have some companionship and to share a sandwich for lunch, the St. Elizabeth's Guild would be the perfect group to share a quick bite with. They meet on the 3rd Thursday of each month at noon in the Chapel.

If you need safe pair of ears to rant and rave to or someone to turn to for comfort and solace, seek out a Stephen Minister. They are trained to listen and to be there for you in your time of need.

There are also book clubs where ideas and opinions can be exchanged and a place where men can go to eat badly without being chastised for their dietary choices.

If you wish to spent a couple of hours helping out the less fortunate, just ask Sophie and she will schedule you to help in the office or the Soup Hour.

There is also the Pastoral Committee who are quick to send flowers when an illness or misfortune strikes. I know as I had flowers delivered to me when I tripped over my sleeping dog in the night and ended up with a black eye when I fell on the floor. Of course, that is not all they do. The committee also manages the beautiful annual Feast of Lights which honors and remembers those who have passed. And I could go on and on but won't, as I am sure everyone is aware of all the groups that meet and get together on a regular basis at St. Matthias. Try out some of them or all of them. You might just surprise yourself at how much enjoyment you might find, and since attendance is not compulsory, you can come and go as you please. I know we all have a life outside of the St. Matthias but it is also a blessing to have a life within St. Matthias as it is while sharing and praying with one another that we grow in Christ and find the peace that passes all understanding.

For many, many years, during the annual rainy season, St. Matthias has experienced very expensive roof repairs over the Church portion of our facility. We are again faced with this situation and the vestry, after much debate and discussion, has authorized the replacement of the complete roof over the church area. This will eliminate future expensive roof repair.

You may ask the question: "Where are we getting the funds to do this major work, when our budget is only allowing us (at this time) to hire a part time priest?" This is a very legitimate question and deserves a straight forward answer. It is the vestry's responsibility to keep the congregation apprised of what is happening at St. Matthias.

Many years ago St. Matthias established a "Futures Fund" to take care of future needs of the church. This fund was and still is designed to fund major Capital Expenditures and funding of new ministries. The fund does not allow spending for every day operating expenses. Currently the fund has grown to over \$500,000.00. Your vestry has been very careful over the years not to tap into this fund.

These current roofing problems can be considered as a major project, especially with the current weather predictions. We have contacted three (3) reputable roofing contractors and are currently waiting for their responses.

So, when you start seeing people tearing up our roof, please understand the situation and the source of funding to do the repairs. *Stan Jamieson*

Article from the St. Matthias Treasurer

On February 11, 2024 the 2024 budget was presented at the Annual Meeting. We are moving in a positive direction with pledged income and fairly steady rental income. Our 2023 financials end of year reports showed we stayed under budget overall and "in the black". We have a large, unexpected expenditure looming in our future that concerns our roof repairs. Vestry has approved obtaining some estimates on re-roofing the church (nave and sanctuary area) as the recent rains have illuminated additional leaks.

For 2024 our budget is not "balanced", and we expect about a \$55,000 deficit by the end of 2024. This deficit may shrink depending on when in the year we are able to call a new rector. In Kathy Underwood's presentation at the Annual Meeting, we learned that we can only offer a salary for a half-time Rector. I will continue to post the monthly financial reports in the display case in St. Francis patio.

I am grateful to you all for your generous support of the ministries of St. Matthias to be able to continue to "do the loving thing". I am especially grateful for the expert finance group of Liz Villalva, Carol McCracken, Diana Jimenez, Mona Paladino and Sophie McIntosh.

Recipe Corner

LaVerne Edmunds shares this recipe for Ham Glaze to try on our Easter Hams.

Prep Time: 10 minutes.


Cook Time: 2 hours


INGREDIENTS

- 1 (5 to 7 lb.) fully cooked smoked ham
- 1 1/2 cups Smucker's® Strawberry Preserves
- 1/3 cup prepared mustard
- 1/4 cup lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

- 1. HEAT oven to 325°F. Score fat surface of ham with sharp knife, making uniform diagonal cuts about 1/8-inch deep and 3/4-inch apart.
- 2. PLACE ham fat side up on rack in shallow roasting pan; bake 1 1/4 to 2 1/4 hours.
- 3. COMBINE preserves, mustard and lemon juice in small saucepan; cook over low heat, stirring until blended.
- 4. BRUSH ham with about 1/2 cup glaze during last 20 minutes of baking time. Let ham stand 10 minutes for easier slicing. Heat remaining glaze and serve as a sauce for the ham.


